REFUSED MATERIALS

- Soiled paper or cardboard
- Plastics without a number or with number

- Propane bottles, aerosol cans and fire extinguishers
- · Windows, mirrors, light bulbs and Pyrex glass
- Organic wastes
- Etc.



- Rinse containers to prevent odors and protect workers' health.
- Put materials loosely into the bin.
 They must not be in bags.
- You need more space in your green bin? Compact containers to maximize space.

BLACK BIN



REFUSED MATERIALS

According to regulation, the following materials are prohibited in the black bin:

- · Medicines and biomedical wastes
- Recyclable materials (e.g., paper and cardboard, plastic containers, glass and metal)
- Household hazardous wastes (e.g., paints, batteries, oils, pesticides, propane bottles)
- · Construction and demolition materials (wood, gypsum board...)
- · Electrical, electronic appliances and computers
- Green wastes (e.g. dead leaves, grass clippings and Christmas trees)
- Tires and car batteries
- · Furniture and mattresses

BROWN BIN

ORGANIC MATERIAL

YOUR MUNICIPALITY IS PLANNING THE ARRIVAL **OF YOUR BROWN BIN (ORGANIC MATERIAL).**

Why collect organic material?

The Québec Policy on Residual Materials (Politique québécoise de gestion des matières résiduelles) seeks to completely eliminate by 2020 the disposal of organic material in waste burial sites.

The brown bin is complementary to domestic composting. Everything not placed in your domestic composter goes into the brown bin, including meat and meat bones, fowl, fish, dairy products, facial tissues and small animal litter.

It is important, however, that we continue all our efforts in household composting and in grass and leaf recycling. The least polluting waste is the waste we have not created

RULES TO BE FOLLOWED

GREEN BIN

Recyclables only. Bring excess to the ecocentre. Green bins containing non-accepted materials will not be emptied and any contents placed outside the bins will not be collected.

BLACK BIN

Household wastes only. Black bins with refused materials will be not emptied and wastes next to the black bins will not be collected.



ADVICES

- The black bin should be considered as last option.
- The weight of materials placed in the black bin determines the bill to be paid
- · The heavier it is, the higher the

WHEN

Place the bins at the roadside the evening before collection and remove after the collection is complete.

HOW TO PLACE YOUR BINS

Recycling and waste bins must be placed side by side, with a minimum space of 100 cm around each bin, handles and wheels towards the house so that nothing prevents access for mechanized arm.

IN WINTER

Completely remove snow and ice from top and sides of bins so that they are easily accessible. Bins covered with snow or hard to reach will not be emptied.

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE (HHW)*

Paint, aerosol, varnishes, solvents, pesticides, cleaning products, engine oil, compact fluorescent light bulbs, fluorescent tubes, propane bottles, batteries, ink cartridges. fire extinguishers, etc.

* These products can also be brought to the HHW depots.



CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, DEMOLITION **MATERIALS**

Wood, branches, Christmas trees, metal, concrete, asphalt shingles, bricks, stone, gypsum, floor coverings (carpet, linoleum, ceramic, etc.), showers, baths, sinks, toilets, etc.



ELECTRICAL, ELECTRONIC, TECHNOLOGY DEVICES

Appliances with halocarbons (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers), stoves, dishwashers, washing machines, dryers, small and electrical appliances, televisions, videos, radios, computers, peripherals, cell phones.



FURNITURES

All furnitures (sofas, mattresses, tables, chairs, etc.)



MISCELLANEOUS OBJECTS

BBQ, lawn mowers, pool covers, swings, etc.



GREEN WASTES

ACCEPTED ONLY AT MONT-TREMBLANT AND SAINTE-AGATHE-DES-MONTS ECOCENTRES. DURING SPRING AND FALL PERIOD OR YEAR ROUND AT RÉGIE INTERMUNICIPALE DES DÉCHETS DE LA ROUGE (RIDR).

Dead leaves, grass, stems and twigs.



RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

TIRES AND CAR BATTERIES

All car and truck tires, without rims, and car batteries.
