

DEAR CITIZENS,

Members of the Municipal Council and the administrative team join me in wishing you a happy and healthy 2019, one during which all of your wishes come true! Thank you once again for the confidence

you have shown in me! As you know, the Council is doing its best to ensure the protection and conservation of our precious environment. In fact, this is what differentiates us from others and we are really proud of it. It is with this in mind that the Council decided to move forward and hire someone in the summer of 2019 to increase awareness of the importance of conforming to regulations respecting riparian strips. This resource will also conduct an analysis of Lac Manitou to ensure that our lake is healthy, and we hope free of any invasive aquatic plants.

You will also find in this Information Bulletin, our budgetary previsions for the 2019 fiscal year. Amounts had to be set aside to improve certain roads, notably for the cleaning and backfilling of ditches as well as the replacement of troublesome culverts. To maximize our investment, we are always looking for any potential government subsidies from which we can benefit.

Additionally, there is the emergency measures plan that we must address immediately. A few years back, the municipality of lvry-sur-le-Lac was covered under the plan of the City of Sainte-Agathe-des-Monts, however, as this is no longer the case, it is now a priority for us to put into place a comprehensive plan, one that ensures the safety of our citizens in the event of disaster.

Kindly be aware, as well, that many of our partner organizations have increased the percentage we need to pay for services they provide, which has had direct consequences on our budget.

RESIDUAL WASTE

RECYCLING OF DOMESTIC BATTERIES

For the disposal of all small household batteries, a container exists in the vestibule of the City Hall in which you can deposit used batteries.

GREEN PATROL

Eco-Advisors will travel throughout the territory for a few days in the spring to respond to any questions and help citizens navigate through the many concerns they may have respecting the collection of organic waste. Therefore, do not be surprised to see them knocking at your door to drop off information brochures on the collection of organic waste and guide you through this new enriching adventure for the benefit of the environment.

BURNING PERMIT

With the exception of fires in fire pits, grills, and barbecues, it is mandatory to obtain a burning permit, all year round, regardless of the season. All you have to do is go to the *Régie incendie des Monts* website at www.ridm.quebec/permis-de-brulage/ and fill out the online form. Now, even if the camp fire is totally unplanned, by filling out the request online, the permit is delivered to you immediately, completely free of charge!

Please note, however, that it is forbidden to light fires within 15 m of the riparian strip and within the strip itself. Also do not forget to check on www.ridm.quebec that the fire risk index allows for open fires before lighting such a fire.

CRIME STOPPERS

PROTECTION OF SHORELINES, LITTORAL ZONES AND FLOODPLAINS

Regulation no. 2013-06 – chapter 9 and Politique de protection des rives, du littoral et des plaines inondables, chapter Q-2, r.35

RIPARIAN STRIPS - A PRIORITY

The Québec policy on the protection of shorelines, littoral zones and floodplains aims to protect lakes and rivers and safeguard the water resource as well as all life forms that depend on it.


Shorelines, littoral zones and floodplains are essential to the survival of the ecological and biological components of the many bodies of water and lakes. Furthermore, the importance of preserving native riparian plant species is undeniable, as they have genetic characteristics that allow them to survive in harsh environments, particularly by adjusting to damage caused by snow, ice, and waterborne materials.

In order to bring about a change in behaviour among citizens, at the beginning of the summer season, we will be undertaking an intensive period of awareness, followed by other incentives to improve and protect the health of our lakes.

To be fully effective, the measures will focus on the control of vegetation within the three layers (herbaceous plants, shrubs and trees), where the mowing of grass and brush is not authorized:

- Within 10 metres of the high-water mark when the slope is less than 30%. It is permitted, however, to create a 5-metre wide opening along the shoreline to access the body of water.
- Within 15 metres of the high-water mark when the slope is greater than 30%. In this case, it is permitted to create a 1.2-metre trail or stairway that does not require filling or excavation.

Kindly be aware that construction is **prohibited** along the shoreline.



REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE EMPTYING OF SEPTIC SYSTEMS

Regulation no. 2009-031

When a property is used as a primary residence, its septic system must be emptied at least once every two years. For residences only being used on a seasonal basis, this process may be done every 4 years.

Once done, the onus is on the property owner to send the Municipality proof that this has indeed been completed. Also, an annual maintenance contract is necessary for certain types of septic installations (Ecoflo, Bionest, Enviro-Septic, etc.)

This year, all our records will be updated. So, if you have not already done so, please ensure you send us proof that the systems have been emptied or should annual maintenance contracts be needed, proof that these are in place.

DOG OWNERS

Regulation 2007-016 (Contrôle des chiens) et 2013-062 (Nuisances)

All dog owners must obtain a dog licence within fifteen (15) days following its acquisition or its permanent arrival on the territory or before the dog reaches three months of age, whichever is longest.

Cost: \$15 (neutered or spayed), \$30 (not neutered or spayed)

In addition, here are some rules of conduct that must be respected at all times:

- · Ensure the dog always wears its license;
- Always keep an eye on your dog and keep it on a leash:
- Dog owners and walkers are responsible for cleanliness and must immediately clean up after their dog;
- Dog owners are also required to be mindful of a dog's barking.

Please note that it is strictly forbidden to have a dog in the park close to the boat launch as well as on the beach on the south side of the lake.

MUNICIPAL BOAT LAUNCH

Regulation no. 2011-040

PERMITS AND CERTIFICATES

Regulation no. 2013-059 and Zoning Regulation no. 2013-060

Considering that the municipal administrative team is quite small, give yourself plenty of time to submit your request for a permit if you want to ensure it is received within the expected time limits.

As well, please do not venture to begin any work without a permit. Instead, we invite you to work with the municipal team throughout the process.

Also, while the following list is not exhaustive, a request for a permit is needed for the construction, extension or renovation of a main building, of a secondary building (garage, shed, boat house, docks, etc.), of certain accessory equipment as well as the construction of a well or any sanitary installation.

Should you have any doubt, avoid any potential costly problems and discuss your plans with the Municipality. This will pay off in the end!

For any requests for permits in the riparian strip or in the littoral zone, it is of utmost importance that the marker demarcating your property from your neighbour's is well identified. Without this marker, it is impossible to validate if the distances respect the regulations set out in the zoning bylaws. Sadly, it will therefore be impossible to deliver the coveted permit as this is the only way we can ascertain the location of the boundaries.

FEEDING ANIMALS CAN BE HARMFUL TO THEIR HEALTH AND OURS

As well as causing many health problems within the deer population, feeding them simply encourages them to come close to our homes which can increase the risk of road accidents. Therefore, please choose our health and theirs and don't feed them!
